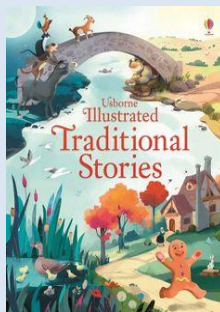


English:

- writing our own versions of a known story
- using capital letters and full stops accurately
- using exclamation marks to demarcate sentences
- using question words like, who, where, what and when

Maths:

We will focus on addition and subtraction, place value and measurement and will be developing the following skills;

- Number bonds and related subtraction facts.
- Adding and subtracting one-digit and two-digit numbers.
- Solving problems.
- Counting forwards and backwards to and from 50.
- Counting, reading and write numbers to 50 in numerals.
- Counting in multiples of twos, fives and tens.

End of Year 1:

x2, x5, x10

*Plus related facts

$3 \times 2 = 6$ so $6 = 2 \times 3$

Time:

Recall and spell names of days and months and know related number facts. *September is the 9th month and has 30 days*

Religious Education:

The children will be learning about, "Jesus Miracles" from the Bible. They will first discuss what a miracle is and then focus on the three stories, "Jesus walking on water", "Feeding the 5000" and "The calming of the storm."

Science:

Our Topic this half term is Seasonal Changes and we will be:

- Observing changes across the 4 seasons.

History & Geography:
